COLLECTING SAMPLES INSTRUCTIONS:

Collect up to 10 of the suspect snails. Place them directly into a container of 70-95% ethanol (rubbing alcohol will also work) and place vials in the freezer.

Other Information You May Want to Collect

Sample Location

Record the sample GPS position.

Depth

Measure depth at each sampling site regardless of whether snails are present.

General habitat type

Record sediment type (based on how the rake feels when in contact with the bottom) at each site where snails are sampled as: (a) mucky, (b) sandy, or (c) rocky.

For photos, sharp focus is most important, and close-ups of the diagnostic features such as (e.g. # of whorls, operculum) are very helpful, as well as an overall view of specimen. If possible use small coin for scale.
